Jose Pedro Croft A TRANSIENT INSTANT January 29 – March 26, 2022

The exhibition consists of a group of engravings and drawings made in 2021.

In the context of José Pedro Croft's work, this series is a step forward in relation to the process art of the last decade. Now the use of clipping, collage, and proportional asymmetry in both paper and support is a twist that sophisticates the relationship between geometry and disorder distinctive of all his practice.

The large engravings are created by means of several plates and successive prints with twists and shifts that are reassembled in a dynamic collage. Each print is made up of up to five different papers assembled in a collage, which is radically new in the graphic field. As in his sculptural works, the image is completed with the empty spaces of the clipped papers.

In contrast, the small engravings are the result of direct action on the plate and appear as strokes of color on irregular papers.

The set highlights the relationship between Croft's graphic work and his sculptures, which share concepts such as folds, unfolding, the expansion of the frame and the instability of perception that forces us to move around the work to look at it again and again.
